

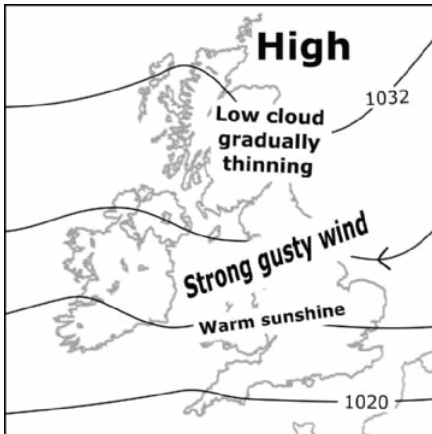
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Sunday, 12 July, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 12 July, 2026**

Cloud shrouds many hills in Scotland and NE England in the morning, more broken westwards; slowly tending to thin to leave patchier cloud on higher tops mainly eastern Scotland by afternoon. A notably strong gusty easterly wind for England & Wales, but mostly sunny. Warm for Wales & Peak District.

**Headline for Southeastern Highlands**

Low cloud and early dampness, improving. Wind fairly light.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 12 July, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	East-southeasterly 10mph, occasionally 15mph around Callander, local gusts 20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small to negligible.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Spotty drizzle fades</b> A lingering drizzle on some hills in the morning, this fading to be generally dry by middle of day.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive, thickest low cloud in morning, breaking tendency</b> At dawn, extensive cloud to most lower slopes, fog into some glens. Lifting through morning, bases towards central highlands increasingly broken to or above 900m afternoon. East of A9 slower to break, patches may linger over high terrain much of day.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>10% early, rising to 30% east, 60% towards central highlands.</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Overcast, misty poor visibility over hills to start. Glimpses of sun breaking out, best breaks west with very good visibility. Cloudiest near east lowlands.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	10 or 11C, rising to 13C towards central highlands as cloud clears.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	East-southeasterly, some variability, 10-15mph, strongest southern hills where gusty to middle slopes. <b>Fairly small, but nuisance gusts common southern hill groups with some light buffeting.</b>	East or southeasterly 10 to 20mph, typically strongest on hills nearer the central belt near Callander. <b>Mostly small, some breezier spots mainly toward the south.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Breaking into patchy banks</b>  Cloud may be fairly extensive at dawn, highest tops near or just above the cloud layer. Soon after sunrise cloud begins lifting with breaks forming, just patchy banks on high terrain by later in the day, little or none towards central highlands.  <b>Rising to 80%</b>	<b>Higher terrain clear</b>  Fog in some glens, possibly a sheet of low cloud covering low to mid-level hill slopes from dawn, brief fragments may drift upslope, but retreating eastward and dispersing during morning. Tops generally clear all day.  <b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	A patchwork of cloud and sunshine. Very good visibility.	Strong sunshine and excellent visibility on hills, early mist lower down, leaving some low level haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	9C rising to 12 or 13C, mildest towards central highlands.  Above the summits.	14C from dawn (warmer than many lower slopes and glens), rising to 17C (central glens reach 25C).  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 13 July, 2026

A fine week of summer weather - warm and dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. High pressure north of the country keeps the skies mostly clear, some low-level cloud rolling inland from the North Sea at times. A prevailing easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures to western hill groups, valley temperatures often 25C, or warmer for Wales and Peak District, at times 30C. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Notably dry ground conditions, beware very high fire risk. Later in the week, an increasing risk of thundery showers forming, with a cooling trend into the weekend 18-19th.
