

Southeastern Highlands

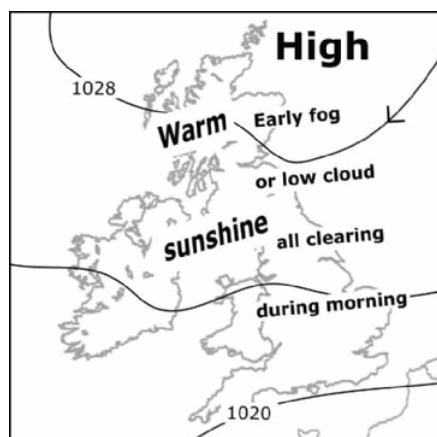
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Wednesday, 15 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 15 July, 2026

Warm across the hills with strong sunshine. Fog for lower eastern areas from dawn - Scottish hills above the fog, whilst low cloud banks drift onto hill slopes over Pennines for a few hours. Easterly breeze, strongest for south Pennines & Wales. Extremely dry ground, beware of fire.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Warm and sunny, early low fog. Light wind, local gusts.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 15 July, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	East or southeasterly 5 to 10mph, local occasional gusts 15mph rarely 20mph on mountains mainly in Callander area.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, locally some noticeable gusts around some southern hills.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Mountains clear, early low inversion From dawn, fog confined to glens and only lowest hill slopes most widely toward the lowlands where lasting a few hours during morning, thinning away to the North Sea.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine on hills all day. Excellent visibility on high terrain, early low fog leaves some low-level haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	16C from dawn (warmer than glens), rising to 19C (glens reach 25C, slightly cooler furthest east).
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 16 July	Friday 17 July
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Northeasterly, 5 to 10mph, occasional 15mph mainly eastern hills and later in the day. Small.	Northerly 15 to 20mph. Fairly small, but feeling noticeably cooler on hills.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain unlikely An odd pocket of drizzle possible mainly toward Angus hills.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Hills clear Fog over the North Sea comes back inland overnight into the lowlands and some glens around dawn, soon retreating back to the coast. Hills widely clear. Practically certain	Little if any Some patchy cloud banks may drift onto some slopes in the morning, but lifting and leaving the hills generally clear. 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine over the mountains dawn til dusk, occasional thin high cloud. Visibility excellent, some fog at first areas toward the lowlands, may leave a haze.	Patchwork of sun and cloud. Visibility very good, slight haze toward the central belt.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	16C from dawn, (warmer than glens at first), rising to 19C (central glens reach 25C). Above the summits.	12 to 16C, warmest central highlands into afternoon. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 16 July, 2026

Settled summer weather continues into the weekend and next week as high pressure dominates. Warm temperatures on the hills in midweek will trend cooler from the north from Friday into the weekend, dropping below 10C on summits for periods, mainly Scottish mountains. Most persistently cooler in the north where some cloud will be drawn over the tops at times, occasional light showery rain. Otherwise generally ongoing dry weather, with good amounts of sun and many hill tops often clear of cloud. Continuing very high risk of fire with extremely dry ground conditions. A change of weather pattern late in the month brings scope for rain and thundery showers.
