

Southeastern Highlands

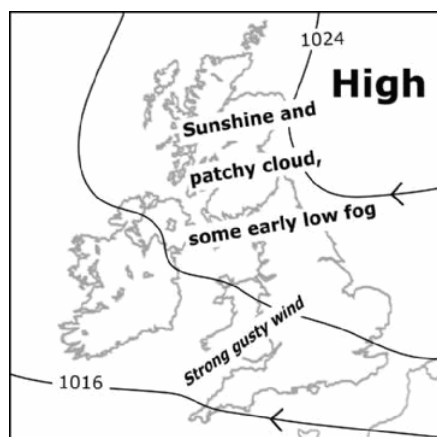
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Monday, 24 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 24 August, 2026

Dry overall with sunshine and broken cloud. Some early low-level fog patches will soon disperse, briefly cloud drifting over some hill slopes, but most mountains often clear all day. Light-moderate south-southeasterly breezes, locally gusty, stronger easterly winds mid & south Wales.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Dry with sun, mostly clear hills. Local gusts.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 24 August, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southerly trending southeasterly, 10-15mph, rising a little into evening and more gusty 20mph in places.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little expected Banks of cloud at varied heights to start, mostly low-mid slopes with some fog in glens. Patches lift to cap some higher slopes during the morning, but most cloud then above the higher summits by afternoon. Later evening, cloud lowers onto the tops from southeast and fills in overnight more widely.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun. Very good visibility, some haze southernmost hills.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8C rising to 11C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 25 August	Wednesday 26 August
How windy? (On the Munros)	Easterly 15 to 20mph, occasional 25mph on mountains mainly in Callander area.	Easterly 20 to 35mph, gusty in places, typically strongest west-central highlands.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, locally feeling breezier and gusty around southernmost tops.	Blustery, some notable gusty areas may suddenly affect balance around high tops and locally downslope to the west.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzle on and off Drizzle in the air, may be frequent for periods in morning making it generally damp, but small amounts of rain in total.	Mostly little rain Patchy drizzle some eastern slopes where in cloud. Odd spots from high cloud elsewhere, perhaps a burst of rain forming.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive, slowly breaking Varied cloud banks from lower slopes upward in the morning, some higher slopes may be briefly above cloud layers, but tending to drift higher up. Breaks forming, but patches likely come and go on tops.	Fairly extensive Shrouding many hills above 600 to 800m, some lower banks for periods on southern slopes. Local breaks at times, best toward north of Loch Tay.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30% rising to 60% afternoon.	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, may break up a little to give some sun, thin high cloud. Visibility very good below cloud, but some hills mistier for several hours.	Fairly cloudy, some sun through high cloud at times. Some haze, but visibility fairly good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C rising toward 10C, though eastern tops likely stay cooler.	10C, up to 13C out of cloud afternoon. Feeling like 2 to 5C in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 25 August, 2026**

Low pressure to the south will develop and drift across Britain into the second half of this week bringing increasingly wet conditions widely. Areas of rain will drift northward during Wednesday, possibly thundery showers forming over England & Wales. Heavy and thundery rain likely affects England, Wales & southern Scotland on Thursday-Friday, potentially prolonged heavy falls bringing a risk of flooding locally. Northwest Scotland likely driest. The eastern Highlands often covered in low cloud. Strong gusty easterly winds prevail for a few days through midweek. Into the weekend it remains unsettled with areas of rain and heavy showers, plus cooler northwesterly winds developing.
