

Southeastern Highlands

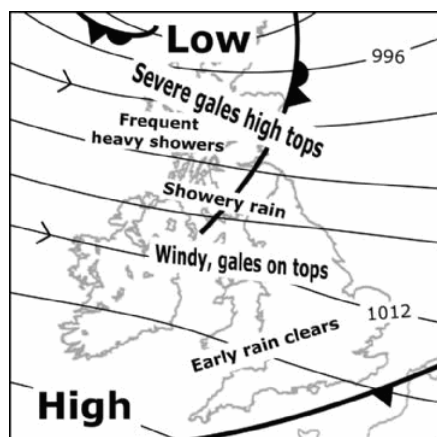
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Friday, 4 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 4 September, 2026

Gales over high terrain in all areas, severe on higher mountains making progress very challenging and feeling cold. Showery rain, most frequent in western Scotland, scattered heavy bursts passing eastward. Remnants of overnight rain soon clears from Wales to be more often dry, less windy southwards.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Gales, severe on tops. Bursts of rain passing eastwards.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 4 September, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southwest then westerly, 45 to 55mph, at times 60mph higher summits, powerful gusts in showers and peak speeds tending to rise during day, gusts to 70mph particularly frequent in afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Arduous to difficult walking conditions, frequent buffeting knocking you off balance on exposed terrain. Any mobility at times challenging on tops. Significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Intermittent rain, showery bursts Showery rain most frequent for central highlands up to A9, but a cluster of more frequent showery bursts passing eastwards during the morning, then briefly drier, but a scattering of heavy showers extend east again during afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly western areas, some breaks Varying over high terrain often above 800-900m, some lower banks in rain central highlands to 700m or lower for a time. Breaks more often toward 1100m in east away from showers.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30% west to 60% east.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, occasional sun mostly east early morning and again into afternoon. Visibility often good, but reduced at times in rain, mostly central areas.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7 or 8C, little change all day. Directly in the wind, feeling like -5C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 5 September, 2026

Generally unsettled through the next week with spells of rain and showers moving in from the Atlantic, accompanied by frequently strong to gale force mountain winds. A window of better weather and less wind on Saturday, but further rain moves into Scotland from the southwest by Saturday night into Sunday, heaviest northwest Highlands; gales also return to many mountains by Sunday. Temperatures will vary, mildest toward the south, but cooler air moves in from the north at times next week bringing higher Scottish tops occasionally close to freezing point. Indications favour improving weather patterns during mid-month.
