

Southeastern Highlands

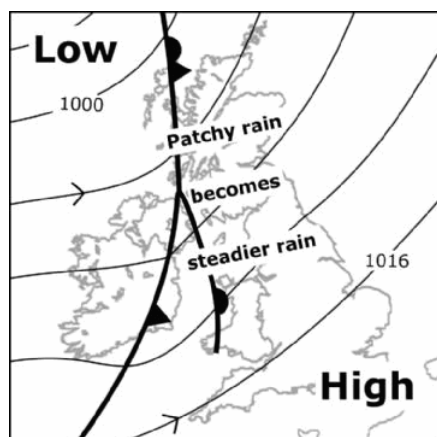
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Thursday, 10 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 September, 2026

Windy, gales over Scottish mountains and increasingly on higher tops of England & Wales. Rain starts patchy and light but becomes persistent over western hills, extending eastwards with time. Cloud capping most high tops, lowering in rain particularly in the west.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Wind strengthens to gales on tops. Rain develops heavier.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 10 September, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Southwesterly 25-35mph from dawn, soon strengthening from west in morning to sustained 40-50mph over high tops and notably gusty for a few hours in middle of day. Easing later afternoon to 30-35mph. Walking increasingly arduous in exposure, frequent buffeting knocking you off balance on exposed terrain through middle of day. Moderating later in daytime. Considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Patchy rain then setting in Drizzly patches of rain drift from the southwest in morning, tending to increase with time; driest for longest east of A9. Steadier rain extends in from southwest to become fairly persistent much of the region, some heavier falls extend east afternoon. By evening, breaking up into showery rain.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Tops mostly shrouded, becoming more extensive Covering many upper slopes in the morning above 700-800m, some lower patches central highlands, local breaks some north-facing slopes. As rain develops, cloud fills in widely and lowers to widely 600-700m. Bases then lift into evening with some breaks above 800m. 30% dropping to 10% in rain.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare weak sun in morning mainly east, becoming more overcast. Varied visibility, good in places below cloud, becoming poor in rain.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	6C rising to 9C afternoon, then lowering slightly into night. Feeling like -5C in strongest wind. Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 11 September, 2026

Changeable west-southwesterlies prevail through mid September; often windy, gale-force winds for periods over higher terrain. A window of drier weather this Friday, then the next frontal system sweeps in overnight into Saturday with a sustained fall of rain moving southeastward, accompanied by upland gales for most places. Improving for better weather on Sunday, then wind and rain returns into Monday, staying showery into Tuesday. A mixed outlook likely continues later next week with rain most frequent in western Scotland. Temperatures varying, some cooler days especially in Scotland, but often fairly mild further south, at times quite warm and humid.

Forecast issued at 16:10 on Wednesday, 9 September, 2026
