

Southeastern Highlands

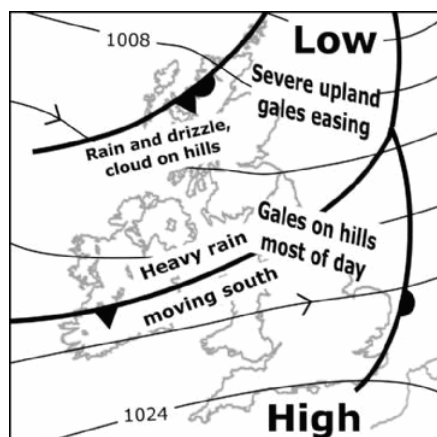
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Erich, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Saturday, 12 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 September, 2026

Severe gales from dawn on Scottish mountains ease during morning, moderate speeds by mid-afternoon, whilst gales continue on tops in England & Wales until later. An intense band of rain moves south, followed by still frequent rain, some showery bursts plus low cloud western hills. Drier later north Scotland.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Gales in morning lessening. Patchy rain, cloud breaks east.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 12 September, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southwesterly 60 to 70mph early morning with peak speeds around dawn, lessening gradually during morning, to 30-40mph into early afternoon, shifting westerly, 25mph mid-afternoon to evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Very difficult conditions with powerful gusts to low levels for several hours, moderating into middle of day, but still challenging in exposure with considerable wind chill; smaller effects onward through afternoon.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Early heavy rain, then patchier and drizzly; showery rain for a time afternoon Sustained heavy rain from before dawn into the morning, particularly central highlands. Intensity soon eases, but rain and drizzle continues on and off into afternoon, drier windows eastward. A band of showery rain moves south by later afternoon, patchier in east.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, some improvement Blanket cloud across the hills during rain, to lower slopes central areas. Some rise of base develops during day, varying around rain, best of any breaks higher up east of A9, clearing some tops with time.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	10% rising to 40% east of A9.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast, brighter skies develop, some weak sun later mainly east. Visibility poor in rain, may improve later, but a haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8C, up to 10 or 11C for a few hours. Feeling like -5 to -8C directly in wind in morning.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.
