

Southeastern Highlands

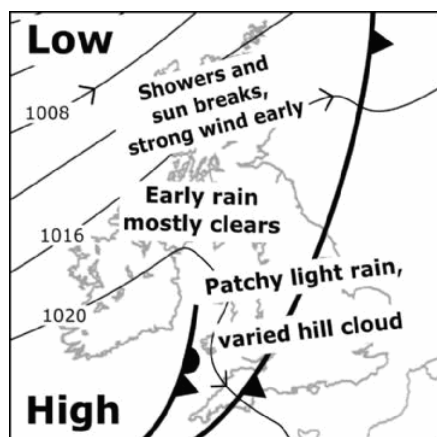
The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Loch Ericht, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Friday, 25 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 25 September, 2026

Windy in Scotland, showers west, only scattered eastward where often sunny; wind lessens for a time afternoon. Patchy rain England and Wales, tending to break up in north England later. Rain and cloud linger in Wales and south Pennines but rainfall totals small; mild-to-warm, little wind in Wales.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Windy early; a few showers west, east hills mostly clear

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 25 September, 2026

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southwesterly 25 to 35mph, local gusts approach 40mph over tops in the morning; lower speeds midday into afternoon, though staying above 20mph. Wind will restrengthen into/overnight.
Effect of wind on you?	Strenuous over tops in the morning, buffeting gusts affecting balance with considerable wind chill. Effects will lessen, locally fairly small in afternoon, then deteriorating again overnight.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	A little rain now and again Occasional showery rain mostly western-central highlands, but often dry much of the region, particularly further east.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly western tops, rare cloud east Varied cloud over hills in Callander to Loch Tay area above 800-1000m, some higher breaks forming with time. More often above 1000m east of the A9, often broken above the tops.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	60% west to 80% east.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun, best toward east of Glenshee and into Angus. Some high cloud may linger towards the east into afternoon. Visibility very good, reduced briefly in rain, and a little haze around to the south.
How Cold? (at 900m)	6 or 7C, little change all day. Feeling like 0 to -3C in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 26 September, 2026

South to southwesterly winds prevail onward into the weekend and next week. Saturday will be bright for many, windy in Scotland with some showers in the west. Mild-to-warm temperatures, but a chilly feeling north in wind. A band of rain sweeps eastward more broadly on Sunday; rain could be very heavy for a few afternoon hours. A window of higher pressure is indicated for Monday with warmer, brighter conditions for many, but northwest Scotland starts breezy with cloud and some light rain. Into mid-next week, risk of a more widespread gale, or severe gale over higher mountains. Detail of timing is uncertain, but several bands of rain punctuated by showers and bright spells will likely cross most mountain areas. Unseasonably warm temperatures. The weather stays mixed into early October.
