

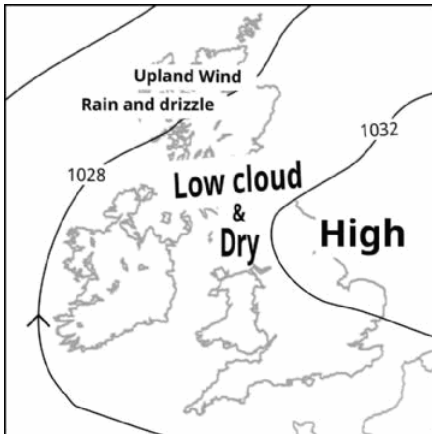
Southern Uplands

General Summary for Saturday, 2 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 2 November, 2024

Widely dull and murky, breaks in cloud most likely in eastern Scotland and western Wales. Rain or drizzle in West and Northwest Highlands, elsewhere most likely dry. In northern Scotland windy, elsewhere mostly light winds. Mild.

Murky but mostly dry, light winds, mild

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 2 November, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable, mostly southwesterly, 5 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Low risk occasional drizzle from low cloud.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, may locally break Hills covered in cloud from the lower slopes to the tops, particularly Dumfries & Galloway, but cloud may locally start to break. Higher bases and breaks more likely eastern areas.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Very little or no sun west, but sunnier locally furthest east. Poor visibility due to extensive cloud.
How Cold? (at 750m)	8 to 9C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable, 10mph or less. Toward Galloway perhaps 15-25mph, southerly.	Mostly southeasterly, 15mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Small or negligible.	Small or negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Extensively dry, risk local drizzle Chance localised drizzle toward Solway.	Rain unlikely Extensively dry, but drizzle here and there - most likely near Solway.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied cloud banks, some breaks Low cloud and fog in the valleys, varied banks on mid slopes and drifting higher up in places, leaving some tops clear or at times between cloud banks.	Extensive Cloud probably extensive above 600 to 750m, although may break up in places. Additionally, patches of fog some lower slopes, particularly morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Variable sun and cloud, excellent visibility if above the cloud. Hazier or misty lower down in morning.	Sunshine coming through in some places, but overall cloudy or dull. Persistently hazy.
How Cold? (at 750m)	Around 9C	5C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 3 November, 2024**

High pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until Tuesday afternoon, when a weak front passage will deteriorate weather for a day along the western coastal mountains especially. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week. During the weekend, more often wet conditions are likely, but at this stage uncertainty is still fairly high.
