
Southern Uplands

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General Summary for Wednesday, 30 April, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 30 April, 2025

Fine and warm, or very warm Wales and Pennines. Strong sunshine, some thin high cloud; beware sunburn and dehydration. Toward northwest Scotland, strengthening southwesterly winds, more cloud at times, one or two brief showers. Into night, some rain moves into Scotland from the west.

Sunny and warm, light-moderate breeze.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Westerly 15-25mph. Locally gusty around the Borders and Central Belt. Mostly small, just beginning to impact walking on higher exposed terrain.	West to northwesterly 15 to 20mph, occasional 25mph on high tops mainly Galloway. Fairly small, but feeling blustery in places on exposed higher terrain.
		Marked wind chill especially morning.
How wet?	Odd bursts of rain	Possible light showers
(Precipitation and its impact)	Brief moments of showery rain passing eastwards associated with a weak front, mostly spots from high cloud layers.	Risk of one or two brief showers, mostly into the afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Patches mostly west	Little if any
	Fragments of low cloud on coastal slopes of Galloway, lifting toward or above tops. Likely clear all day toward and east of the M74.	Brief patches forming around some upper slopes in the morning, lifting above all summits.

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun best in east in morning, high cloud builds from west to cover sky for periods. Visibility excellent.	Sunshine most widely morning, then broken cloud and sun. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 750m)	8 to 11C, warmest around the Borders into middle of day; a cooling trend afternoon into evening, to 5 to 7C.	3C rising to 6 to 8C, coolest Galloway. Wind chill feeling like -3C in morning.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 1 May, 2025

Dropping colder across the Highlands by Thursday, near to freezing on higher summits; strong westerly winds in the north giving considerable chill factor and bringing a few showers. Warmer further south - risk of local thundery rain for Wales later Thursday. High pressure centred toward the northwest maintains plenty of dry weather over the Bank Holiday weekend with broken cloud and sun; brief local showers possible. Cool and breezy toward north and eastern mountains, lighter winds and warmer toward southwest Highlands, Cumbria and west Wales. Further into next week, risk spells of chilly and strong west-northwesterly winds particularly for the Highlands, some showery days.
