

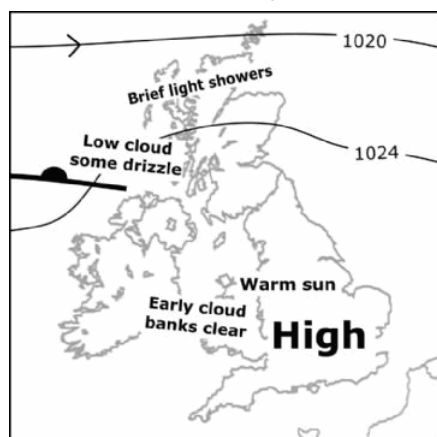
# Southern Uplands

The Galloway hills eastward to the Lammermuir hills. The Cheviots (including higher hills within the adjacent Northumberland NP).



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## General Summary for Wednesday, 18 June, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 18 June, 2025

West to southwest breezes will feel cool over Scottish mountains, strongest toward the north. Cloud will be drawn onto western hills, some drizzly rain or brief showers. Higher cloud eastwards, often above tops. England & Wales dry and mostly sunny, warmest south.

### Headline for Southern Uplands

Cool breeze. Largely dry, most hills clear.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 18 June, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West to southwesterly 20 to 25mph, strongest in the morning and toward Borders.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small, but may feel blustery and rather cool in exposure on higher tops.
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain not expected</b> Chance of brief misty drizzle westernmost hills.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Occasionally on western tops</b> Patchy cloud banks drifting over Galloway hills above 500-600m, coming in from west from time to time. Further eastwards, patchy cloud some slopes in morning, but hills largely clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>70%, to above 90% east.</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Varied cloud west, sunnier eastwards. Visibility very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	7C rising to 10C. Feeling like 2 to 4C in the wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to southwesterly, 10mph or less.	Southerly 10 to 20mph, strongest Galloway hills, gusty around some slopes.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Negligible</b>	<b>Mostly small</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>Rain not expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Not expected</b>	<b>None expected</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny, some early high cloud. Visibility excellent.	Sunshine and high cloud, which may sometimes obscure the sun. Visibility good, some haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	Rising from 10 to 16C, then little change into evening and night.	16C from dawn, rising to 18C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 19 June, 2025

High pressure centred to the east draws very warm air in on southerly breezes through the rest of this week. Dry conditions, sunshine and fair-weather cloud, some patchy coastal cloud at times in west, locally gustier winds too. A more uncertain outlook into the weekend and early next week, a good deal of fine and warm weather possible, but risk of some rain or showery bursts at times.
