

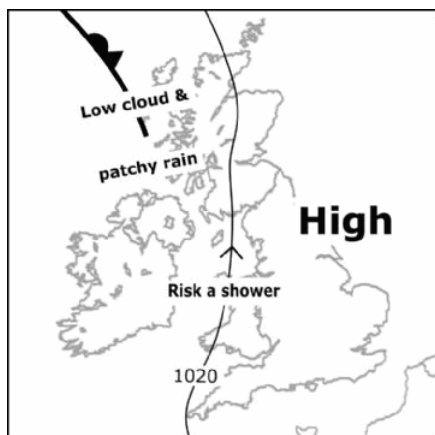
Southern Uplands

The Galloway hills eastward to the Lammermuir hills. The Cheviots (including higher hills within the adjacent Northumberland NP).



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General Summary for Saturday, 23 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 23 August, 2025

Cloudy skies for many places, varied areas of low cloud on some hill slopes in the morning, largely lifting above the tops, but may continue to cap higher western mountains in Scotland, with a little rain occasionally. An odd shower in north Wales in afternoon. Winds generally light.

Headline for Southern Uplands

Largely dry, cloud generally lifting above hills; light winds.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 23 August, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable west becoming south-southeasterly, 5 to 10mph, increasing a little on Galloway hills to 10-15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance an odd patch of drizzle around low cloud, possible spots from high cloud.
Cloud on the hills?	Covering some hills for a few hours Areas of low cloud at varied heights from dawn, some patchy fog into valleys at first. May linger on some hills all morning, greatest risk in east; largely lifting above tops into afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60% rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun and mostly thin high cloud. Some areas start misty, visibility becoming excellent.
How Cold? (at 750m)	7 to 9C from dawn, coolest east. Rising to 13C afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 24 August, 2025

High pressure drifts slowly east, whilst low pressure over the Atlantic encroaches nearer in the early part of the new week. Southeasterly winds increasing Sunday-Monday, soonest for western regions, becoming much windier by Monday in west, then more widely with time. Areas of rain and showery bursts increasingly widespread as the week progresses as low pressure then rotates slowly over Britain - day-to-day detail becomes very uncertain. Warmer and more humid for a time, then cooler later in week.

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
