
The Galloway hills eastward to the Lammermuir hills. The Cheviots (including higher hills within the adjacent Northumberland NP).





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General Summary for Thursday, 13 November, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 13 November, 2025

Cold northeasterlies for the Highlands, gale-force over mountains early in day. Snow mostly in northern areas. A slow-moving swathe of rain for southern Scotland and northern England, heavy at times. Previous rain eases to patchy light rain in Wales, but beware of flooding - staying mild here.

Headline for Southern Uplands

Upland gales, rain all day, heavy at times, snow on tops.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 13 November, 2025

| How windy? (On the summits) | Northeasterly 30 to 45mph most of the day; strongest gusts toward west, at times risk over 50mph some slopes. |

| Effect of wind on you? | Walking strenuous-to-arduous; expect considerable buffeting and wind chill. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Persistent rain, some heavy, turning to snow high tops; flood risk. Widely heavy rain from dawn into morning, turning to snow above 600-700m, briefly wet snow to 500m in places. Into afternoon, rain may break up a little, but persisting in many areas all day; fading into night. Very wet underfoot, streams in spate, flooding likely especially later. |
| Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits? | Extensive Shrouding many hills all day from middle slopes up. Some rise of base in places if rain starts to break later in day. Below 10% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Overcast and dull. Visibility poor. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | Around 0C, starting nearer 2C in south. Feeling like -10 to -13C in direct wind. |
| Freezing Level | Above southern summits at dawn, but lowering to 700 to 800m, nearer 600m at times in heavier precipitation. |

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 14 November, 2025

High rainfall with significant flooding expected for Wales by the end of this week, risk flooding too in Peak District. Drier overall across the Highlands. Strong to gale force easterlies later this week, then northerlies are expected to dominate onward into next week. Colder air extends to all areas, staying below freezing over higher mountains most likely throughout next week to 10 days. Some accumulations of snow over Scottish mountains, initially mostly northern areas, possibly more widely across all mountain areas during next week - Tuesday-Wednesday in particular, but lower confidence of forecast detail by then.
