

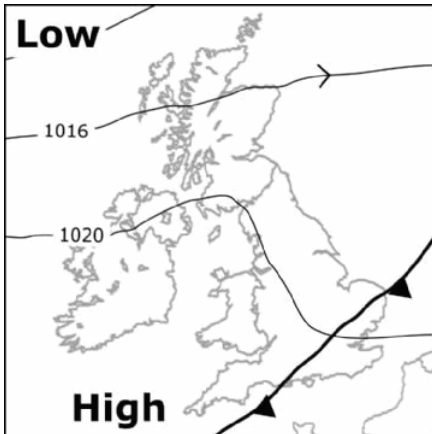
Southern Uplands

General Summary for Saturday, 20 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 20 June, 2026

Windy with a few drizzly showers and low cloud N and W Scotland. Elsewhere, fairly light wind (particularly Wales and S Pennines), and extensively dry. Widespread fog will clear most summits - although patches of fog lower slopes near some west coasts.

Headline for Southern Uplands
Fog clearing the hills. Fairly light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 20 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest to westerly 15 to perhaps 20mph on higher tops.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Mountains starting foggy, but clearing Improving markedly as fog across the hills lifts to clear the hills by about midday, although fog may intermittently cap areas 400m near Solway.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% rising to greater than 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun developing. Visibility very good or excellent.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C to 12C, warmest afternoon Borders.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southern Uplands - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 21 June	Monday 22 June
How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 10mph or less, possibly 15 or 20mph toward evening.	South to southwesterly between 15 and 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible.	Fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	Risk bursts of rain, possibly thundery Confidence low: it may well remain dry. But risk of a few bursts of rain, perhaps brief although later in day small risk thunderstorm.
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected Local patchy cloud on some slopes near Solway for a time, but all dispersing, or cloud then forming above the summits.	Very little for most of the day - may form in rain. Generally the hills free of cloud although fog may form higher slopes in rain. Coastal cliffs and lower slopes near the Solway may be foggy
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine weakened at times by areas of high cloud. Visibility excellent or superb.	Patches of sunshine although extensive high level cloud. Visibility good, although a haze.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C at dawn, rising to 15C afternoon.	17C - very warm and also humid.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 21 June, 2026**

Extensively dry and very warm indeed England and Wales although around Monday chance of thunderstorms. Rain and low cloud at times Scotland, mainly affecting western mountains - although later next week the warmth further south may penetrate north into or perhaps to all Scotland.
