
West Highlands

Western Highlands accessible from, and south of, Glenfinnan (Road to the Isles) and Glen Spean (includes Creag Meagaidh). This area includes Ben Nevis and the mountains around Glencoe. In the east, from Ben Alder south to Loch Lomond and Trossachs NP. Also Arran and Mull.

General Summary for Friday, 29 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 29 August, 2025

Rain frequent or persistent for western Scotland most of the day, some slow-moving heavy bursts, these extending increasingly eastwards over the Highlands. Clusters of showery rain over western England and Wales will drift eastwards during the day on fresh and gusty winds.

Headline for West Highlands

Frequent or persistent rain, showery bursts. Increasing wind.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 29 August, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Variable in the morning 10-15mph, trending westerly as the day goes, rising largely towards 20-30mph, strongest southern coastal areas.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small morning. Comfortable walking becoming be affected in south afternoon. Notable gusts around afternoon thundery showers.
How wet?	Often raining, risk thunder later
(Precipitation and its impact)	Rain frequent throughout the day, persistently heavy at times; from dawn mostly toward coastal areas, but extending increasingly inland during morning. Into afternoon, downpours forming with local thunder inland.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive
	Extensive from middle slopes up at dawn, cloud banks drifting down lower coastal slopes. Well inland, particularly north, bases rising somewhat with some breaks towards higher terrain, though filling in again during rain.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Little or no sun. Visibility often poor in cloud and rain, though very good during breaks.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8 or 9C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Cloud base varying, but extensively shrouding the mountains, above 600-800m near coasts, 800-1000m well inland, some lower patches at times; brief breaks higher up mostly inland if drier at times.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 30 August, 2025

An unsettled weekend ahead driven by low pressure to the west/north of Scotland. Brisk westerlies will drive showery rain onto western mountains, at times drifting eastwards. Some local thundery downpours may arise. Saturday in particular will be very windy with widespread risk of gales and heavy rain setting in from the southwest. Sunny periods will arise between weather features, greatest chance in eastern areas later in the weekend and early next week. Next week stays mixed with low pressure in charge, frequent rain or showers continuing. Some improvement later in the week as pressure tends to rise.
