
# **West Highlands**

## General Summary for Thursday, 18 December, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 18 December, 2025

Scotland: South to south-west gales bringing hill fog and showers, before band of heavy, perhaps squally, rain moves up from the southwest in afternoon, snow tops.

England and Wales: Heavy rain spreading north with hill fog becoming extensive with strong to gale force southerly winds.

#### **Headline for West Highlands**

Gales, significant wind chill with showers. Heavy, squally rain afternoon, snow tops.

# Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 18 December, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to southwesterly 40 to 60mph, risk 70mph for a time along a squally band of rain in afternoon, possibly lessening for a time mainly in southern areas later in day.		
Effect of wind on you?	Ongoing arduous conditions over higher terrain, walking often difficult in exposure, significant wind chill.		
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers, then rain, some snow tops Showers, easing for a time, before more constant band of heavy perhaps squally rain		
	moves in from southwest in afternoon; possible hail, and falling as snow as low as 900-1000m. Showery onward into the night with hail.		
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive, some breaks north		
	Covering most hills all day, from mid-slopes up coasts and south. Some higher breaks inland Lochaber, lowering in rain.		
Chance of cloud free Munros?	20%, to 50% north Lochaber.		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, visibility varying, good intermittently if dry, but reducing to poor if rain or hill snow becomes constant.		
How Cold? (at 900m)	1 to 3C, then lowering to 0C into night. Wind chill feeling like -12 to -15C on tops.		
Freezing Level	1000 to 1200m, rising for a time, then dropping into night to around 900m.

## **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 19 December, 2025

South-southwesterly winds widely remain gale force over the mountains later this week and through into Saturday, severe upland gales for periods. Showery on Friday, most frequent in western Scotland with hail, also snow over tops. Another belt of persistent rain likely arrives onto western hills into Saturday, snow only highest Scottish tops. A switch to east-southeasterly winds by Sunday into early next week, some residual rain and high-level snow, but a drier theme develops and favouring chillier conditions into the Christmas period.

#### Forecast issued at 16:35 on Wednesday, 17 December, 2025
