

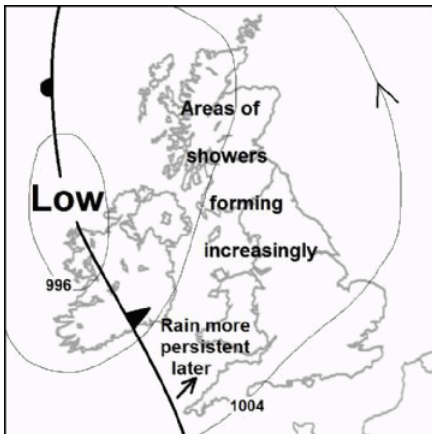
Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, also south to Forest of Bowland and Ilkley Moor.



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General Summary for Friday, 24 June, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 24 June, 2022

Localised showers in the morning, but many places will be dry for a few hours. Showers forming more widely by afternoon, some heavy with hail and thunder, but some places missing them completely. More constant rain moves into Wales later where southerly winds may touch gale force on tops. Quite warm and feeling humid.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines

Thundery showers forming. Early low cloud lifting.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 24 June, 2022

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly or variable, 10 to 20mph or sometimes less. Tending to increase into evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, but sudden gusts may form around bursts of rain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Thundery downpours mostly into afternoon Chance of bursts of rain locally from early morning, but forming mostly by middle of day onward. During afternoon and early evening, possible areas of rain lasting an hour or more, but nearby escaping drier. Some heavy downpours, risk hail and thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Lifting to many tops, but forming again in showers. Varied cloud conditions: Banks of cloud at various levels from dawn, lifting toward higher tops with breaks forming during morning. Then where showers occur, cloud banks forming again on tops, patches to some lower slopes.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A mix of some strong sun and periods where high cloud may fill in. Visibility very good, slight haze forming, reducing where rain develops.
How Cold? (at 700m)	12C rising to 15C, feeling humid.
And in the valleys	Mild from dawn, 12 to 14C, soon rising, reaching 20 to 23C, warmest eastern Dales.

Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 25 June	Sunday 26 June
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly, 15 to 25mph, sometimes stronger gusts in places during and prior to rain. A breezy day on the hills, may become increasingly blustery which may impede walking on higher tops.	Southerly 25 to 40mph, risk stronger gusts for periods on higher tops. Blustery all day, but sometimes walking will be arduous, perhaps difficult on higher tops. Considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers forming, locally heavy Patchy possible from dawn, but several hours likely largely dry. Showers then forming into afternoon, some heavy bursts later, likely focused on western areas, chance of hail and isolated thunder.	Showery Bursts of rain on and off, risk merging to become more constant rain for periods during the day, focused on western areas. Heavier bursts may contain hail, chance of isolated thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Often above the hills A few patches around hills early morning, generally dispersing. Then most cloud above the hills, but local patches forming around higher tops during and after showers, mostly western tops.	Often above hills, lowering in rain Most cloud confined to patches on higher fells by mid-morning, then often above many tops. Occasionally lowering, mainly if rain becomes persistent.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine mostly morning before cloud builds and tends to fill in. Visibility often very good, but reduced where rain occurs.	Glimpses of sun, but mostly cloudy. Visibility sometimes good, but reduced around rain, occasionally poor.
How Cold? (at 700m) And in the valleys	7C rising to 11C. Cooler overall, starting around 8 to 10C, reaching 17 to 19C by afternoon.	7 to 11C. 6 to 8C at dawn, rising to 16 to 18C into afternoon.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 25 June, 2022**

Unsettled for several days through the weekend into early next week as a slow-moving area of low pressure affects Britain. Conditions will vary day-to-day, locally escaping dry some days, but expect some areas of persistent rain mixed with heavy or sometimes thundery showers almost anywhere. Wind speed also varied, mostly south or southwesterly, strengthening at times, may reach gale force on the high tops into next week. Feeling warm where sunshine develops, but cool in cloud and rain. Cloud will come and go on the hills, but lowering extensively during rain.
