

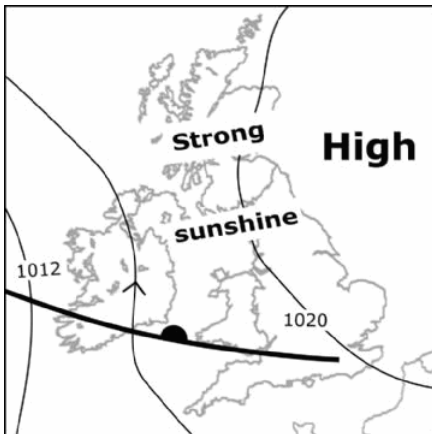
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

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General Summary for Sunday, 11 August, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 August, 2024

A fine, warm and sunny day for most places. Early light showers in northwest Scotland fading. Increasingly humid Wales and south Pennines. Light winds in the morning, strengthening southeasterlies in afternoon; toward dusk reaching gale-force near west coast of Scotland - bursts of rain arriving here into the night.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Breeze increasing. Strong sunshine.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 11 August, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly, speeds rising during daytime from 10 to 20mph. Reaching gusty 30-40mph into the night.
Effect of wind on you?	Small, becoming noticeably breezier during afternoon; deteriorating into the night.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Morning mist in some valleys, soon widely clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny, high UV; high cloud building late afternoon/evening. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 700m)	12C rising to 16C afternoon; warmer and more humid air into evening, but offset by the strengthening winds.
And in the valleys	12C at dawn. Rising to a warm 23C by afternoon, staying muggy into evening.

Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines - Looking Ahead

	Monday 12 August	Tuesday 13 August
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly, very gusty 30 to 40mph from before dawn into morning. Then southwesterly, 15 to 20mph or less. Challenging turbulent conditions early in day, but likely to moderate with time to become fairly small.	South to southwesterly, 20 to 35mph. Blustery over higher terrain, walking arduous for periods where exposed.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Thundery rain for a time Risk of extensive rain for a few hours, some embedded heavy and thundery bursts tracking northeastwards during middle of the day. Likely to clear to leave just rare drizzly showers.	Drizzly then rain arriving west Starting largely dry, then patchy drizzly rain pushing in from the west, becoming fairly persistent rain around western Yorks Dales. Smaller amounts elsewhere.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Extensive in rain During and just after rain, varied but fairly extensive low cloud from lower slopes upwards. Gradually lifting and thinning, some breaks forming; banks may linger toward western Dales. 40%	Increasingly extensive Varied banks of cloud mainly over western areas in the morning, some breaks for a few hours toward northeast. Cloud generally lowering over most hills, filling in above 400-500m western Yorks Dales. 30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Some sun developing later as high cloud thins. Misty in rain, visibility improving to become good by later afternoon.	A bright start in the east with good visibility for a few hours. Cloud thickening in west to become dull with poor visibility especially in rain.
How Cold? (at 700m) And in the valleys	Humid 16C from before dawn into morning, but likely to fall during day as a cold front passes, to around 12C. A muggy 19 to 22C despite risk of rain at times; starting to feel fresher later in day.	11 to 13C. 12C at dawn, rising to 17 to 19C.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 12 August, 2024

West to southwesterly winds will prevail during the week ahead, maintaining generally unsettled weather patterns coming in from the Atlantic. Frequent and at times heavy rainfall concentrated over western mountains, where ground conditions increasingly saturated. Often extensive low cloud. Periods of strong to gale-force winds are likely midweek onward. Generally cool and unsettled toward next weekend.

Forecast issued at 16:00 on Saturday, 10 August, 2024
