

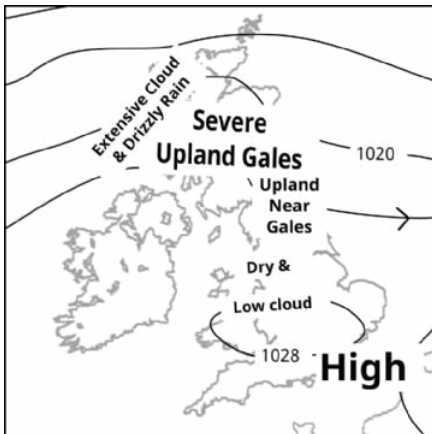

General Summary for Thursday, 31 October, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 31 October, 2024

Widely murky, mostly overcast skies but dry, only in western Scotland drizzle. Mild, but severe wind make it feel cold in Scotland. Marked increase of wind speed with height in the north, severe gales over Scottish mountains. In Wales lot of sunshine above very low clouds.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Windy, cloudy and dull, extensively dry, mild

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 31 October, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly, widely 20-30mph, less in the south. On northeastern side of Pennines gusts may exceed 40mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery, walking impeded, gusts may locally throw you off balance. Significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or no rain Drizzly showers not fully ruled out, but most likely dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, chance for clear tops Cloud fairly persistent in the valleys and on lower fells. Above 600-700m chance for clear spells, but most of the day also highest tops covered.
Chance of cloud free summits?	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and murky most or all day. If not in cloud visibility excellent, but mostly cloud making visibility poor.
How Cold? (at 700m)	10 to 13C. With wind chill feels like below 5C.
And in the valleys	10 to 14C, rising only a little through the day.

Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines - Looking Ahead

	Friday 1 November	Saturday 2 November
How windy? (On the summits)	Starting west to southwesterly, 25 to 35mph. Gradually easing to 10-20mph.	Variable, mostly southwesterly, 5 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery in the morning, comfortable walking impeded. Becoming small.	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Low risk rain afternoon Chance for a little rain in the afternoon on the North Pennines.	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills covered, some tops clear at start Low cloud covering hills from lower slopes or valley bottoms upward, during the day cloud slowly lifting to clear lower slopes.	Hills covered in cloud, most likely from 600-800m upward at start, but low cloud may also cover valleys. Cloud slowly lifting, may partly break. Chance for higher cloud base on the eastern slopes.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Clouds coming and going, most of the time only weak sunshine. Excellent visibility if not in cloud.	Glimpses of sunshine, but generally cloudy. Very good visibility if not in cloud.
How Cold? (at 700m)	Around 11C	Around 9C
And in the valleys	10 to 13C, rising only a little through the day.	8 to 12C, rising only a little through the day.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 1 November, 2024

After wet Friday in Scotland, back to high pressure for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion conditions developing mean locally very misty or cloudy, and tops sometimes above cloud. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until mid next week, when a weak front passage will probably deteriorate weather for a day, at least in Scotland. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and warm weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week.
