

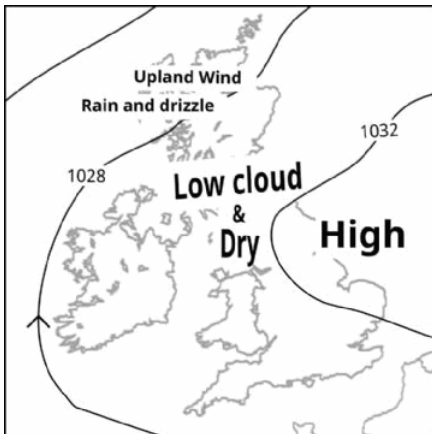
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

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General Summary for Saturday, 2 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 November, 2024

Widely dull and murky, breaks in cloud most likely in eastern Scotland and western Wales. Rain or drizzle in West and Northwest Highlands, elsewhere most likely dry. In northern Scotland windy, elsewhere mostly light winds. Mild.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Murky but mostly dry, light winds, mild

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 2 November, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable, mostly southerly, 5 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Low risk occasional drizzle from low cloud.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, may break, likeliest east Fells covered in cloud, most likely top to bottom in morning. Cloud slowly lifting to mid or some upper slopes, may partly break locally, best chance for that east of Kirkby Stephen.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sunshine, but generally cloudy. Very good visibility if not in cloud.
How Cold? (at 700m)	Around 9C
And in the valleys	8 to 12C, rising only a little through the day.

	Sunday 3 November	Monday 4 November
How windy? (On the summits)	Mostly south or southeasterly, 10 to 20mph.	Southeasterly, 15 to 20-25mph. At times may be complete lull.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain unlikely Extensively dry, but chance drizzle here and there.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied cloud banks, some breaks Low cloud and fog in the valleys. Varied banks drifting onto higher slopes, but some tops above or between cloud banks. May increasingly clear, but some slopes may hold onto fog all day.	Extensive - may break up Confidence low: Cloud probably extensive above 500 to 650m, although may break up through the day. Additionally, patches of fog some lower slopes, particularly morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Plenty of sunshine and excellent visibility if above the cloud. Hazier or misty lower down in morning.	Cloud may break to give sunshine. Persistently hazy.
How Cold? (at 700m)	Around 10C	6C
And in the valleys	9C rising to 13C	Around 11C

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 3 November, 2024

High pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until Tuesday afternoon, when a weak front passage will deteriorate weather for a day along the western coastal mountains especially. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week. During the weekend, more often wet conditions are likely, but at this stage uncertainty is still fairly high.
