

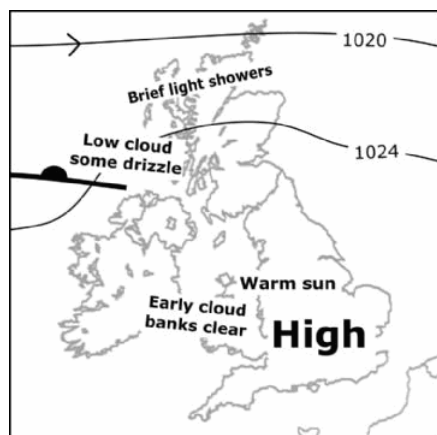

General Summary for Wednesday, 18 June, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 18 June, 2025

West to southwest breezes will feel cool over Scottish mountains, strongest toward the north. Cloud will be drawn onto western hills, some drizzly rain or brief showers. Higher cloud eastwards, often above tops. England & Wales dry and mostly sunny, warmest south.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Fine with sun, fells largely clear, light-moderate breezes.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 18 June, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 15 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little or none Patches of cloud may drift over some higher slopes in morning, mainly western Dales. All lifting above summits.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun, best eastern dales. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 700m)	8C rising to 12C.
And in the valleys	11C at dawn, rising to 19C afternoon.

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly or variable, 10mph or less.	South to southeasterly 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	Mostly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected	None expected
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny. Visibility excellent, some haze may develop.	Sunshine and high cloud, which may sometimes obscure the sun. Visibility good, some haze.
How Cold? (at 700m)	Rising from 12 to 17C, then little change into evening and night.	16C from dawn, rising to 19C.
And in the valleys	12C at dawn, rising to a humid 24C afternoon.	12C at dawn, soon rising above 20C in the morning, reaching 25C afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 19 June, 2025

High pressure centred to the east draws very warm air in on southerly breezes through the rest of this week. Dry conditions, sunshine and fair-weather cloud, some patchy coastal cloud at times in west, locally gustier winds too. A more uncertain outlook into the weekend and early next week, a good deal of fine and warm weather possible, but risk of some rain or showery bursts at times.
