



General Summary for Tuesday, 8 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 8 July, 2025

A bright and sunny morning particularly in the east, then thickening cloud will lower across Scottish mountains from the west, with rain and drizzle developing, persistent in west; wind also increasing. England & Wales sees sunshine then high cloud, lowering onto tops by evening with a little rain arriving.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Moderate breeze. Sunshine then high cloud, a little rain later.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 8 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwest then westerly 15-25mph, strongest around dawn, easing for a time during morning, then increasing again later in daytime.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but blustery at first, then becoming noticeably breezier again later.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Dry until late Local spots of drizzly rain late in the day. May be entirely dry until near dusk.	
Cloud on the hills?	Fells cloud-free after morning	
	Patchy banks of cloud drift around high fells early mainly North Pennines, soon lifting off the summits. Intermittent banks will return to high tops of North Pennines as night falls.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90% most of the day	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Morning sunshine gradually weakened by building high cloud.	
How Cold? (at 700m)	8C at dawn, rising to 12 or 13C, warmest on east slopes.	
And in the valleys	8C at dawn, rising to 17 to 19C.

	Wednesday 9 July	Thursday 10 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 15 to 20mph, up to 25mph for a time in morning higher North Pennines.	West to southwesterly 15-20mph, to gusty 25mph around some tops, mainly North Pennines.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.	Fairly small, but may start to affect ease of walking where exposed on tops.
How wet?	Some drizzly rain in morning	No rain expected
(Precipitation and its impact)	Patchy drizzle or local light rain in the morning, mainly toward north and west. Fading to become generally dry.	
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive, some improvement	Low cloud largely breaking up
	Covering fells fairly widely above 500-600m in morning, or lower for a time in west. Base rising and breaks forming toward higher slopes in east, but may linger over western tops.	Covering many fells early morning, to lower elevations for a time western Yorks Dales NP. Cloud base soon rising and breaks forming during morning, most or all fells clear afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% rising to 50%	30% rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, a little sun breaking through mainly toward east. Visibility becoming good below cloud.	Largely cloudy morning, misty in places. Sun breaking through more with time. Visibility increasingly very good.
How Cold? (at 700m)	11C rising to 15C afternoon, humid.	13C rising to 17C.
And in the valleys	11C at dawn, rising to 21C afternoon.	12C at dawn, rising to 23C afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 9 July, 2025

A humid southwesterly wind during midweek produces extensive low cloud across west and northwest Scotland with some drizzly rain. Drier with sun and broken cloud in eastern Scotland, improving in southern areas. High pressure expanding over England and Wales brings more sunshine and draws in increasingly very warm air again in the later part of this week; higher temperatures and more sunshine extending into Scotland with time. A fine and very warm weekend in prospect, low risk of thundery showers forming toward the west. Cooler with a greater risk of showers early next week.
