

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General Summary for Friday, 25 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 25 July, 2025

Cloud and patchy rain in western Scotland clears east, progressively easing; far east Scotland substantially dry and clear. Patchy cloud over high English and Welsh summits in the morning, deteriorating with the arrival of patchy rain through afternoon. East Wales and south Pennines substantially dry and free of cloud.

Varied high cloud lowers from the north afternoon

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 25 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly 15 to 20mph, at times 25mph higher North Pennines. Most fells seeing 25mph winds for a time in the later afternoon.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small much of the day, but feeling blustery and rather cool around exposed higher slopes.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or no rain Patches of light rain drift into the North Pennines late in the day.	
Cloud on the hills?	Varied over high areas, deteriorating from the north afternoon	
Chance of cloud	Patchy cloud over some tops at first, mostly western Yorks Dales NP. Cloud begins to lower onto N Pennines summits afternoon, covering areas above 700-800m, locally lower west; cloud arriving to highest Yorks Dales tops too. May begin to break as evening approaches. 40%

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Some early sun mostly in east, then largely cloudy; some late sun may break through. Visibility good below cloud.	
How Cold? (at 700m)	12 to 13C, little change all day on most fells; easternmost fells may locally reach 14C. Feeling like 5C in the wind on higher tops.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 26 July, 2025

Westerly winds with mixed weather will prevail through the weekend into next week, bringing patchy rain and some heavier showers at times pushing eastwards - Saturday into Sunday may be quite wet for the west of Scotland. Through the week, periods of rain will be punctuated with decent sun breaks, though northwest Scotland will struggle to clear for sun. Often breezy and feeling cool with temperatures lingering near or below average.

Likely remaining unsettled into the following weekend though details are uncertain.
