

General Summary for Thursday, 9 October, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 9 October, 2025

Westerly gales across Scottish mountains, strongest toward the north, but widely very gusty. Windy also for northern England, lower speeds south across Wales. Low cloud covering most western hills, to lower elevations SW Scotland southwards, with some drizzle. Clearer with some sun in eastern Scotland.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Windy, gales higher areas. Lowest cloud west, local drizzle.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 9 October, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 30 to 40mph, strongest toward north, gusts 45-50mph in places over higher North Pennines and downslope east of high tops.		
Effect of wind on you?	Strenuous walking on higher areas, sudden buffeting in places making balance challenging. Marked wind chill.		
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Patchy drizzle A little drizzle in the air at times, mostly western Yorkshire Dales NP.		
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive higher / western tops		
	Covering western Three Peaks much of the day above 500-600m, or to some lower slopes in the morning. North/east from Kirkby Stephen most cloud above 600m. Breaks to upper slopes best in east.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun mostly eastern areas. Hazy western Dales, better visibility east.		
How Cold? (at 700m)	9C, little change all day, locally 11C east. Feeling near/below freezing in the wind.		
And in the valleys	9C at dawn, rising to 14C afternoon.

Patchy cloud tending to drift above 700m with time, breaks forming.

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun developing, best in east. Hazy or misty start, improving visibility with time.	Mix of cloud and sun, best in east. Visibility good, some haze or mist in morning.
How Cold? (at 700m)	7 to 9C. Feeling near freezing in the wind.	7 to 9C; little change with height in morning, some lower slopes start cooler.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 10 October, 2025

High pressure becomes established over the British Isles into the weekend, bringing quiet, dry weather conditions which continue into next week. Westerly winds prevail in northern Scotland into Saturday, then light winds across the Highlands for several days onward. Easterly winds are expected to increase with time next week for England and Wales. Scope for inversion conditions this weekend and early next week with some valley fog and varied low cloud. Pleasant daytime temperatures, some cooler nights with slight frost where skies are clear.
