

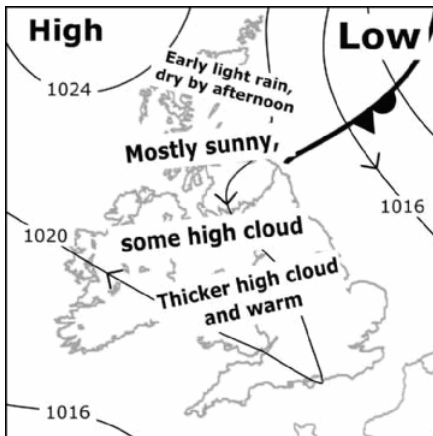
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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General Summary for Sunday, 14 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 14 June, 2026

Some early drizzle and patchy light rain in northern Scotland fades by afternoon. Elsewhere dry all day and often sunny though some high cloud weakening sun in places; sun may be more patchy east Scotland and later northern England. Warm southern Pennines and Wales. Light wind, though starting blustery in east Scotland.

Mostly sunny and mild, some periods of patchier sun

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 14 June, 2026

<p>How windy? (On the summits)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>Northwesterly 15-25mph at dawn, highest speeds Yorks Dales NP, and soon easing to less than 15mph most of the day. Later, a northeasterly shift and speeds near or below 10mph.</p> <p>Mostly small, though blustery in exposure early in the day.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Rain unlikely</p> <p>Remote chance of odd sprinkles of light rain drifting from the north afternoon, but the fells probably entirely dry.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free summits?</p>	<p>Early cloud clears the fells</p> <p>Variable banks of cloud above 600m at dawn, ragged lower patches here and there, and possibly more extensive low banks north and west. Cloud lifts after sunrise to clear the fells; Cross Fell may be slower to clear.</p> <p>Rising to above 90%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Mostly sunny, some high cloud around weakening sunshine, and some thicker patchy cloud here and there, notably early and later.</p> <p>Very good visibility.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 700m)</p> <p>And in the valleys</p>	<p>6C rising to 11C, locally to 12C western Yorks Dales.</p> <p>7C at dawn rising to 15 or 16C.</p>

Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines - Looking Ahead

	Monday 15 June	Tuesday 16 June
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southeasterly 10-15mph most of the day; wind may be light and variable early, and approaching 20mph into evening. Mostly small.	Southwesterly 15mph early, gradually rising, finishing 25-30mph, some stronger breezes over high tops. Fairly small, but increasingly blustery, ease of walking widely impacted later with a chilly feeling.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Patchy rain later The morning is dry, then patchy rain approaches from the southwest through afternoon, falls light with continued dry windows. Rain may only reach N Pennines near sunset.	Substantially dry until later A few patches of light rain drift over the fells from time to time, notably early, but probably dry well into the day, then a risk of more frequent rain, may set in for several hours towards evening.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Early low cloud east clears May be fairly extensive across eastern fells at dawn, perhaps below the highest tops in N Pennines. Cloud will lift in the morning to shroud the tops briefly, but all cloud probably above the summits afternoon. Rising to 90%	High terrain stays shrouded Extensive to at least middle slopes from dawn, to the lower slopes near and south of Tebay. A rising tendency towards 700m, some fleeing higher breaks possible midday/afternoon, but returning more extensively later. 30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mixed cloud and sun morning, best sun west, then high cloud thickening later. Very good visibility.	Mostly cloudy, a few brighter moments afternoon. Very good visibility where out of cloud.
How Cold? (at 700m) And in the valleys	8C rising to 11 or 12C; may stay cooler N Pennines. 5C at dawn, rising to 15C, or milder western Dales.	10C rising to 12 or 13C, some variability afternoon. Feeling like 5C in strongest direct wind. 9C at dawn, rising to 16C, or milder east Yorks Dales.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 15 June, 2026

Through Monday, cloud will return from the southwest and bring some patchy rain with it. From Tuesday onward, a variable southwesterly will dominate through at least mid-week. Windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west; Tuesday into Wednesday is likely a wetter and unsettled period, with the unsettled weather lingering well into Wednesday in Scotland. Warmest in England and Wales, but may stay cooler in Scotland as low pressure to the northwest recycles air from the north Atlantic back onto the Munros. Pressure generally trending higher later in the week, centred southeast of England, but low pressure to the west of Ireland will prevent any extended settled periods with more windy, wet weather at times next weekend; temperatures likely become more widely warm.
