

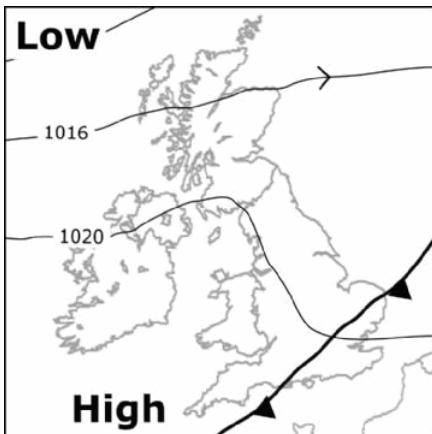
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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General Summary for Saturday, 20 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 20 June, 2026**

Windy with a few drizzly showers and low cloud N and W Scotland. Elsewhere, fairly light wind (particularly Wales and S Pennines), and extensively dry. Widespread fog will clear most summits - although patches of fog lower slopes near some west coasts.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Fog, all or almost all clearing the summits. Light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 20 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest to westerly 10 to perhaps 15mph on higher tops (mainly N Pennines).
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain very unlikely Chance only of the odd light drizzly shower morning.
Cloud on the hills?	Mountains starting foggy, mostly or all clearing Improving markedly as fog across the fells lifts to clear by about midday. Possibly patches coming and going on westernmost slopes above 300m south Kendal.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% rising to greater than 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun developing. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 700m)	11C to 13C.
And in the valleys	Will reach 17 to 20C afternoon; the lowest temperatures western dales in Yorkshire.

Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 21 June	Monday 22 June
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly or variable, often 10mph or less, but may reach 20 or 25mph for a few hours. Negligible much of day.	South to southwesterly between 15 and on higher tops 25mph. Fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance of a burst of rain later in day.	Risk bursts of rain, possible thunder Confidence low: it may remain dry. But risk of a few bursts of rain, perhaps brief although later in day risk thunderstorms.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear most or all day There may well be none, but risk fog now and again higher slopes afternoon (most likely during/after a shower).	Very little for most of the day - may form in rain. Generally the hills free of cloud although fog may form higher slopes in rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine weakened or later giving way at times by areas of high cloud. Visibility excellent or superb although possibly hazy from south later in day.	Patches of sunshine although extensive high level cloud. Visibility good, although a haze.
How Cold? (at 700m) And in the valleys	11C at dawn, rising to 16C. 12C at dawn, rising to 23C afternoon, increasingly humid.	17C - very warm. 22 to 25C in afternoon - feeling humid.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 21 June, 2026**

Extensively dry and very warm indeed England and Wales although around Monday chance of thunderstorms. Rain and low cloud at times Scotland, mainly affecting western mountains - although later next week the warmth further south may penetrate north into or perhaps to all Scotland.
