

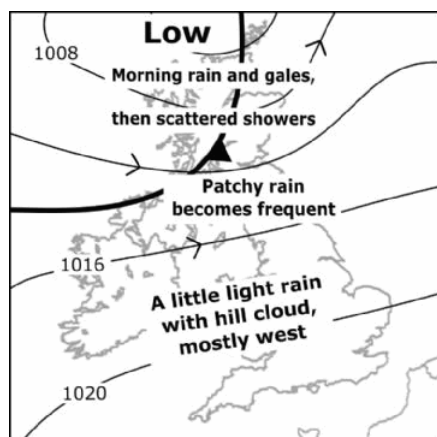
Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

The entire Yorkshire Dales National Park and North Pennines AONB, including the Three Peaks and Cross Fell, plus Howgills, also south to Forest of Bowland.



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General Summary for Tuesday, 1 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 1 September, 2026

A swathe of rain and gales sweeps across the Scottish Highlands, moving over the Southern Uplands with time; bright sun breaks and scattered showers follow from the northwest. Patchy rain for western hills of England and Wales, sunny breaks east. Blustery with rain increasing later in north England.

Headline for Yorkshire Dales & North Pennines

Patchy rain and blustery, both tending to increase afternoon

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 1 September, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 20 to 30mph, gradually trending stronger with sustained speeds reaching 35mph or higher, strong gusts forming over N Pennines to 45mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Ease of walking soon impacted in exposure, steadily becoming more strenuous, later arduous in exposure, strongest gusts affecting balance with considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain or drizzle, most frequent west Some fine drizzle on high western slopes, some showery rain comes and goes, steadiest falls over N Pennines, where becoming more frequent late in the day.
Cloud on the hills?	Most persistent western Dales Covering higher slopes in western Three Peaks area and Howgills much of the day, occasional breaks above 700m. Higher base and better breaks north & eastward, though a rising chance of blanket cloud filling in over all high terrain late in the day.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% west, to 50% north/east, later lowering
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, some brighter moments eastern dales, particularly south but high cloud will thicken. Visibility reduced in rain, better where drier, more often good east.
How Cold? (at 700m)	9 or 10C, rising slightly, to 12C eastern fells afternoon. Little or no change western Yorks Dales NP. Feeling around 0C in strongest wind later in the day.
And in the valleys	10C at dawn, rising to 16 or 17C afternoon.

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 2 September, 2026

The next week remains generally unsettled, and may well bring a deep low pressure systems with widespread gales and swathes of heavy rain. Beyond next week, indications of a more settled regime for a time.
